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1. INTRODUCTION

1.1. INTRODUCTION TO THE NRF

The National Research Foundation Act as amended, Act 19 of 2018, establishes the National Research Foundation ("NRF") as the juristic legal entity that will contract with the awarded bidder. Please visit the NRF website (https://www.nrf.ac.za) for more information.

1.2. BACKGROUND TO SAASTA

The National Research Foundation-South African Agency for Science and Technology Advancement (NRF-SAASTA) is a business unit of the National Research Foundation. NRF-SAASTA's mission is to promote broad public awareness, appreciation, and understanding of science, engineering, and technology in South Africa.

1.3. CONTEXT

NRF-SAASTA Olympiads aim at increasing learner participation and improving performance in SET Olympiads and Competitions in under-serviced areas. The Olympiads consist of four multiple-choice examinations focusing on Physical Sciences Grades 10-11, Life Sciences Grades 10-11, Natural Sciences Grades 4-6, and Natural Sciences Grades 7-9. The Olympiads are a once-off event per year and usually take place in the second term of the school year. This competition is a nationwide competition, i.e takes place in all nine provinces. Approximately 140 000 learners participate annually.

NRF-SAASTA will be embarking on an online examination going forward and the number of paper-based examinations might decrease as more and more schools enrol for the online examination, hence the "on an as-and-when needed basis".

1.4. THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS BID

The overall objective is to appoint a service provider to design, print, and deliver multiple-choice answer sheets to NRF-SAASTA. Scan via an OCR, and produce a report for multiple choice answer sheets for four (4) different NRF-SAASTA Olympiad papers for a period of 36 months on an as-and-when-needed basis. The contracted service provider will work in collaboration with the STEM Education of NRF-SAASTA.

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PART A – BID REQUIREMENTS

- Overall national results per subject

 indicate the number of correct similar responses, the number of incorrect similar responses
 and the number of questions with different responses in percentage.
- National test analysis report, i.e. overall test statistics, test reliability (using the Cronbach Alpha Score) and list the ten hardest and ten easiest questions based on the answers.

The contracted service provider must adhere to:

Providing the required documents that substantiate their responses to these specifications.

2.2. DUE DILIGENCE

Detailed requirements to evaluate the bidder's ability to deliver on the bid. The bidder must provide the following:

2.2.1. BUSINESS PROFILE:

A summarised business profile, <u>relevant to the project</u>, limited to a **maximum of 10 pages**. Relevant experience should clearly be stated.

The Business Profile must include, but is not limited to the following:

- **2.2.1.1.** Proof of location of business:
- **2.2.1.2.** Details of directors of the organisation;
- **2.2.1.3.** List of relevant services and products offered by the bidder;
- **2.2.1.4.** Client list with the same products completed and contact people:
- **2.2.1.5.** An example of your own previous designs and scan-abled answers sheets (not internet downloaded);
- **2.2.1.6.** Example of previously collated result spreadsheets (if confidential, then provide the format):
- 2.2.1.7. Minimum of three years (3 years) experience in designing of and scan-abled answer sheets; and
- **2.2.1.8.** Minimum of one contactable reference letter of a client wherein provision of designing and scanabled answer sheets were delivered. **One of the references should refer to an example as per item 2.2.5 above.**

Note: NRF-SAASTA reserved the right to do a site inspection.

2.2.2. CONTINGENCY PLANS:

Details of contingency planning relating to the project must be submitted, covering **all** the elements below, i.e. if this occurs, how will the job still be delivered on time:

- Labour unrest (strikes)
- Fire
- Extensive power disruptions
- Machinery breakdowns, including the OCRs

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2.2.3. CONFIDENTIALITY:

Confidentiality measures must be described in the bid submission since the staff (including any courier which might be used to collect and deliver completed answer sheets) will be handling personal information (as covered under the POPI Act) as well as confidential examination results. The service provider will also be expected to sign a confidentiality agreement with SAASTA. (**Refer SCC5B**)

2.2.4. COSTINGS SPECIFICATIONS:

- **2.2.4.1.** Quotations must be VAT inclusive.
- **2.2.4.2.** Quotations must include delivery and collection charges, if any, to the stipulated delivery addresses. (Pricing and transportation)

2.2.5. REFERENCES:

Minimum one contactable reference (Designing, printing and scanning of answer sheets) and names of different previous clients with contact details for which the same type of work was done in the past three years.

2.2.6. PROJECT PLAN

Details of project plan must be submitted, covering elements such as:

- Extra machine in case of a breakdown
- Machines in a good working condition by providing proof of maintenance plan
- How many staff available to work on this project simultaneously to deliver on time, i.e. both for printing and scanning together with the reports needed.

2.2.7. ETHICAL REQUIREMENTS

The bidder must confirm that there are no interests with the NRF and its business units, has clean business practices, and has determined its bid independently from others as reflected on its submitted SBD 1, SBD 4, SBD 6.1 forms.

The service provider must allow an inspection of premises by NRF-SAASTA or any representative chosen by NRF-SAASTA. The service provider must also be prepared to demonstrate the OCR, and subsequent report, with samples provided by NRF-SAASTA during such a visit.

If the service provider fails to deliver within deadlines as specified under the service requirements, the service provider will be liable for any costs incurred by NRF-SAASTA to have the specific material printed, scanned, and/or a written report drawn up by a third party.

General conditions of contract will be applicable to this bid.

All costs incurred for submission of the invitation to bid, is for the bidder's account.

SAASTA reserves the right to:

to withdraw and cancel the bid.

3. CONTRACT PERIOD

The contract is for a period of 36 months on an as-and-when needed basis.

4. CONTRACT MANAGEMENT

4.1 Specify the method of delivery and conditions for determining successful delivery after the contract (SBD 7.1) is signed

- 4.1.1 The material must be packaged in quantities specified on the specifications
- 4.1.2 The packaging material used must be suitable for long-distance courier to ensure materials are not damaged in transit.
- 4.1.3 The service provider must provide sufficient staff and equipment (e.g. trolleys) to off-load material to designated store rooms at NRF-SAASTA.
- 4.1.4 The service provider must deliver to the specified NRF-SAASTA premises delivery address

4.2 Delivery and Collection Timing

- 4.2.1 The service provider must provide proofs for sign-off, prior to commencement of printing, within 3 working days of receiving logo(s) from NRF-SAASTA.
- 4.2.2 The service provider must deliver printed material within 3 to 10 working days of receiving signed-off proofs from NRF-SAASTA as specified on the turnaround time in the schedule.
- 4.2.3 48-hour notice must be given before deliveries are made. Working hours are between 08h00 and 16h00 during the week.
- 4.2.4 The service provider must collect completed answer sheets from SAASTA within 24 hours after receiving notification and deliver to SAASTA within one (1) week after completing scanning and submitting reports.

4.3 Minor Changes

4.3.1 Service provider must effect minor changes to the material at no additional cost e.g. replacement or addition or omission of logos, dates, etc.

4.5 Supplier Relationship Management

- 4.5.1 Service providers must be able to avail themselves for meetings as and when they are requested by NRF-SAASTA
- 4.5.2 The service provider must not substitute any material or printing requirements other than stated on the specifications unless discussed with NRF-SAASTA and written consent is given by NRF-SAASTA.
- 4.5.3 The service provider must respond to queries within 24 hours.

4.6 Termination of contract due to non-performance

In the event of the non-performance as per the agreed contract, NRF-SAASTA will appoint an alternative at the cost of the appointed third party. The defaulting third party is obliged to settle the damages/additional costs that NRF-SAASTA has incurred as a result of the non-performance of the appointed bidder. NRF-SAASTA reserves the right to terminate the contract due to poor performance.

4.7 Occupational Health and Safety when working on NRF sites

All personnel performing work on SAASTA site/s as part of this contract are responsible for obtaining safety induction. Over and above the obligations provided by the Occupational Health and Safety Act (OHS Act No 85 of 1993 and its Regulations, known as 'the Act'), the appointed bidder meets with all relevant health and safety instructions as given to them by site safety personnel, where relevant. Personal protection equipment including closed safety shoes, hard hats, height safety equipment, and high visibility vests are worn at all times while on the work site. All personnel are to obey the relevant instructions, including signage, related to restricted access and speed limits on all sites.

The appointed bidder, once signing the contract (SBD 7.1), is responsible for itself, its employees, and those people affected by its operations in terms of the Act and the regulations promulgated in terms thereof. The appointed bidder performs all work and uses equipment on-site in compliance with the provisions of the Act.

To this end, the appointed bidder shall make available to SAASTA the valid Letter of Good Standing in terms of the COID Act and ensures its validity does not expire while executing this bid, where applicable. The appointed bidder furnishes its registration number with the office of the Compensation Commissioner.

The appointed bidder maintains a health and safety plan complying with the requirements of the Act at the work site during the period that contracted work takes place on the site.

SAASTA manages the appointed bidder in his capacity for the execution of this contract to meet the provisions of the Act and the regulations promulgated in terms thereof. The appointed bidder accepts liability for any contraventions to the Act. Each member of the appointed bidder's team (including sub-contracted personnel), submits a signed indemnity form prior to entering the work site and kept in the appointed bidder's health and safety file.

4.8 Original bid documents for the contract signing

The sets of original bid documents in electronic format serve as the original master set for the legal contract document between the contracting parties. The master set remains at the NRF and has precedence over any other copies in the case of any discrepancies within the other sets of documents. The master set has the originals or certified copies of any certificates stipulated in this document attached.

4.9 Managing service levels

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Upon appointment, both parties agree on the final set of performance levels for each deliverable service level including measurable key performance indicators with minimum thresholds in writing which is appended to this contract document. Where both parties agree to a variation of these, both parties sign the revision which is appended to this contract document. The appointed bidder and the SAASTA contract manager measure delivered performance against these performance levels. Where either party has identified poor performance under this contract, both parties will meet and investigate the matter to determine the root cause, the correction plan, and the execution planning thereof. Both parties will monitor the corrective actions. Both parties will assess the applicability of penalties to the incurred poor performance and apply these,

1.1	"Closing time" means the date and hour specified in the bidding documents for the receipt of bids.
1.2	"Contract" means the written agreement entered into between the purchaser and the service provider, as recorded in the contract form signed by the parties, including all attachments and appendices thereto and all documents incorporated by reference therein.
1.3	"Contract price" means the price payable to the service provider under the contract for the full and proper performance of his contractual obligations.
1.4	"Corrupt practice" means the offering, giving, receiving, or soliciting of anything of value to influence the action of a public official in the procurement process or in contract execution.
1.5	"Countervailing duties" are imposed in cases where an enterprise abroad is subsidized by its government and encouraged to market its products internationally.
1.6	"Country of origin" means the place where the goods were mined, grown, or produced, or from which the services are supplied. Goods are produced when, through manufacturing, processing or substantial and major assembly of components, a commercially recognized new product results that is substantially different in basic characteristics or in purpose or utility from its components
1.7	"Day" means calendar day.
1.8	"Delivery" means delivery in compliance with the conditions of the contract or order.
1.9	"Delivery ex stock" means immediate delivery directly from stock actually on hand.
1.10	"Delivery into consignees store or to his site" means delivered and unloaded in the specified store or depot or on the specified site in compliance with the conditions of the contract or order, the service provider bearing all risks and charges involved until the supplies are so delivered and a valid receipt is obtained.

4.1	The goods supplied shall conform to the standards mentioned in the bidding documents and specifications.

5.1	The service provider shall not, without the purchaser's prior written consent, disclose the contract, or any provision thereof, or any specification, plan, drawing, pattern, sample, or information furnished by or on behalf of the purchaser in connection therewith, to any person other than a person employed by the service provider in the performance of the contract. Disclosure made to any such employed person is in confidence and shall extend only as far as may be necessary for purposes of such performance.

The service provider shall procure where necessary the signatures of its personnel for the assignment of its respective contract intellectual property to the NRF or as the NRF may direct, and to support the NRF or its nominee, in the prosecution and enforcement thereof in any country in the world.

The service provider irrevocably appoints the NRF to be its true and lawful agent in its own name, to do such acts, deeds, and things and to execute deeds, documents, and forms that the NRF, in its discretion, requires in order to give effect to the terms of this clause.

SCC5B Confidentiality

The recipient of confidential information shall be careful and diligent as not to cause any unauthorised disclosure or use of the confidential information, in particular, during its involvement with the NRF and after termination of its involvement with the NRF, the recipient shall not:

- Disclose the confidential information, directly or indirectly, to any person or entity, without the NRF's prior written consent;
- Use, exploit or in any other manner whatsoever apply the confidential information for any other purpose whatsoever, other than for the execution of the contract and the delivery of the deliverables; or
- Copy, reproduce, or otherwise publish confidentiality information except as strictly required for the execution of the contract.

The recipient shall ensure that any employees, agents, directors, contractors, service providers, and associates who may gain access to the confidential information are bound by agreement with the recipient both during the term of their associations with the recipient and after termination of their respective associations with the recipient, not to

- Disclose the confidential information to any third party;
- Use the confidential information otherwise than as may be strictly necessary for the execution of the contract; or
- The recipient shall take all such steps as may be reasonably necessary to prevent the confidential information from falling into the hands of any unauthorised third party.

The undertakings set out in this clause shall not apply to confidential information, which the recipient is able to prove:

The recipient acknowledges that the unauthorised disclosure of confidential information may cause harm to the NRF. The recipient agrees that, in the event of a breach or threatened breach of confidentiality, the NRF is entitled to seek injunctive relief or specific performance, in order to obtain immediate remedies. Any such remedy shall be in addition to and not in lieu of any other remedies available at law, including monetary damages.
